Now the tax collectors and sinners were all gathering round to hear Jesus. But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law muttered, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them."

(Luke 15. 1-2)

This is the opening of the chapter that continues with the three 'lost and found' parables:

the lost sheep
the lost coin
and the lost son (often called the prodigal son)
which all relate to this theme.

Do you enjoy debates and disagreements?

Have you been challenged or criticised because of things you have done as an expression of your Christian faith?

Hearing the Word

Read: Luke 5, 27-35

Exploring the Word

As we read the gospels, what other marginalised groups of people does Jesus give special attention to?

Jesus' critics suggest that John the Baptist's disciples are more 'holy' or devout than Jesus' disciples. Do you agree?

Read the Old Testament passage from Sunday: Isaiah 55. I-7

Looking at it alongside the gospel passage, what does it tell us about God's vision for his people.

Living the Word

Should we be concerned to 'fit in', and be popular with the culture around us?

Do we serve God by keeping ourselves separate from the world around us, or by getting involved in it?

(Remember the contrast between Jesus' disciples and the disciples of John.)

In our situation, which groups of people could be the equivalent of 'tax collectors and sinners' for us?

Praying the Word

Take some time to reflect in quiet together, and to offer our thoughts and discussions in prayer.

A prayer based on this theme and reading:

Living God, as Jesus ate with those who were dismissed as 'sinners', and brought them the good news of a new beginning; so may we receive the gift of your forgiving love, and be ready to share it with others, through Jesus Christ our Lord.
