## THE NEW FACILITIES

Work on the rendering on the new extension and the bonded gravel path was done in June.

There were a significant number of snagging issues. The builder remedied some of those but is not able to complete the outstanding list of defects.

A third-party building contractor will start completing the work under the direction of the architect in June.

## **THE ROOF REPAIR**


All the relevant permissions to replace the temporary felt covering with terne coated steel have been granted.

The cost of the work incl fees and VAT is £127k. The work will start as soon as funding is in place. We have secured funding of £82k. Multiple grant applications have been made.

Buckets have to be put out whenever the rain comes in. The work needs to be done urgently due to the state of the ceiling panels and walls.


