



POLICY DOCUMENTS

All documents are on display in the church porch and in the Great Brickhill section of the website Safeguarding – a subject to be taken very seriously:

Annual review of Safeguarding Policy was held in November. A Domestic Abuse Policy was also approved.

No safeguarding incidents have been reported.

Treasurer's Report including adoption of the Annual Report

- Accounts prepared on Receipts and Payments basis
- Deficit for the year of £763

- Large increase in receipts , mainly due to increase in funeral fees and two successful fundraising events

- Despite higher gas prices, lower costs for Heating, Lighting etc due to new programmable thermostat, and high end of contract charge last year.

DEANERY SYNOD

Synod representative position – vacant in 2023

Gavin Merrylees retired as Lay Chair. Dr Annie Cooper is now Lay Chair. Revd Val Plumb is due to step down as Rural Dean.

Gavin Merrylees was Acting Secretary until Malcolm Oliver took on the role at the end of the year. Jeremy Hopkinson has been trying to find a replacement as Treasurer.

DEANERY SYNOD (cont.)

The main point of discussion was the Diocesan Review of C&YP (children & young persons). This topic was discussed by the PCC at a special meeting convened in October.

NEW FACILITIES & ROOF REPAIR

A new contractor carried out the snagging issues in the refreshment area and toilet extension. The architect is negotiating with the original builder to see if there is any outstanding payment due to the builer.

PLUS NCT "Last Chance Churches" £????


This is a special match-funding appeal of £500,000 via the National Churches Trust. 18 churches across the country have been selected to be a recipient of funds from this appeal. The first amount was sent to us in December and a second sum has been awarded to us. A national press release will be released at any time saying how much we have been awarded, until then we can only say £????


THE ROOF REPAIR (cont.)

The projected cost of the work incl fees and VAT was £140k but the total will depend on how much additional work is required due to damage from the water ingress.


The work started on 12th February. The work on both sides of the roof is almost complete. There was minimal damage to the timbers in the south side but a big problem was found on the north side. Additional work has been done costing an additional £10k.


The work on the roof – south aisle






Terne coated steel on the south aisle






The work on the roof – north aisle






Problem on the north aisle, plastic sheeting found







The north aisle – water collected on the plastic sheets

THE ROOF REPAIR (cont.)

Scaffolding will be erected in the south aisle tomorrow in preparation for work on the ceiling panels. More panels are damaged on this side than on the north side.

Painting of the walls will follow but it may be that has to wait until the walls have dried out later in the summer.
