For those not here last Sunday, ....There was a team working in the church last Saturday tackling some jobs to reduce the amount of heat loss from the church. The void under the centre aisle grating has been thoroughly cleaned and insulation laid to reflect the heat up into the church rather than down to the soil floor.

Flagstones in the porch were lifted to lay insulation around the heating pipes. Unfortunately, a leak in the mains water pipe was found and so the flagstones have been left uncovered in order for the soil floor to dry out. Bollards are surrounding the area concerned - please keep clear of the area when walking through the porch. Access to the Food Box is still available.
